



How does RICS manage risk?

Standard model of measuring risk as...

Size of hazard x probability of occurrence = risk

For example, in applying this we are currently reviewing ways in which we assess surveyors for RICS membership based on blend of academic qualifications, experiential learning and expertise/seniority – this we call 'adaptation'.

Adaptation is a way of completing an individual (or firm) gap analysis, filling the gap and then measuring the learning outcomes.

Adaptation and the future

- Greater engagement within firms
- Alignment of structured training to meet market expectations
- Broader access opportunities to encourage diversification of grade and geography (our balanced portfolio needs to have some global economic mitigation. For example, a decline in UK residential markets being offset by increase in demand for construction professionals in UAE, China and India)
- Greater degrees of flexibility and choice to reflect changes in education and training (short, online modular learning)
